TAMPA, FL (September 30) - Ann Kulig, Executive Director of the Westshore Alliance, has announced her retirement after nearly 20 years with the organization. Kulig joined the Alliance as Marketing Director in 2002 and was appointed Executive Director in 2015.

During her tenure Kulig spearheaded the development of a comprehensive public realm master plan and long-range transportation plan for the Westshore District. A visionary leader, Kulig helped define strategic goals for the organization, launched the first District website and District-wide survey. In 2018, Kulig unveiled a rebranding that brought the organization up to date.
